The Australian Pride in Sport Collective is making waves in the world of sport by creating a more inclusive environment for the LGBTQ community. The project, spearheaded by Touch Football Australia and comprising of twelve National Sporting Organisations in partnership with Pride in Sport, has developed a multi-layered approach to addressing the key research recommendations for sporting bodies in Australia.

The project's commitment required each NSO to participate in the Pride in Sport Index, have input into the development of resources, and delivery of LGBTQ specific 'Come and Try' events for each sport. As a result, it has had a huge impact on each sport with the delivery of multifaceted education sessions for staff and members across participating NSOs, and policy support in the space of sport-specific trans and gender diverse guidelines. The project also saw the production of resource guides for participants, administrators, referees/umpires, LGBTQ allies, and peers to improve inclusion in their respective sports. Filming for an online video campaign by The Collective is set to roll out in 2023.

The Pride in Sport Collective must be congratulated on their efforts in creating a more inclusive and welcoming environment for the LGBTQ community.

ACON and Pride in Sport pay tribute to Australian sport pioneer and LGBTQ community advocate, Simon Dunn.

Simon was the first openly gay man to represent any country at the Olympics in the sport of bobsled, and a beloved player for the Sydney Convicts rugby club. He was an ambassador for ACON's Pride in Sport program where he advocated for the greater inclusion of people with diverse genders and sexualities in all levels of Australian sport.

In his capacity as Pride in Sport Ambassador, Simon spoke at the 2022 Australian Pride in Sport Awards where he was interviewed by tennis great Casey Dellacqua. He shared his lived experience of being an out gay male athlete in international sport and spoke of the comradery he received in community sport, and the critical importance that all sporting organisations play in providing safe and inclusive environments for LGBTQ people.

Simon's story touched the hearts of everyone in the room and provided encouragement that while many sports are starting to see the impact an inclusive environment can have on athletes, there is still an enormous opportunity for improvement.

He will be deeply missed but his impact on sport and legacy is one that will not soon be forgotten.

BECOMING A COACH FOR ALL AUSTRALIANS

FIRESIDE CHAT

The Australian Pride in Sport awards is excited to present a Fireside Chat that will tackle the important role of coaches in creating safe and inclusive environments for LGBTQ people in sports. The discussion will feature prominent coaches and influencers in sports who will address the issue head-on.

'Out on the Fields' research (outonthefields.com) shows that 73% of young LGBTQ athletes don't feel safe playing team sports due to homophobic, biphobic, and transphobic slurs and bullying.

To combat this issue, Pride in Sport has partnered with Allianz Australia to launch 'Coach for All', a first-of-its-kind training program aimed at coaches of all levels to educate and teach them how to create a supportive environment for all players and athletes. The program is supported by industry partners and governing bodies including the Australian Olympic Committee, Paralympics Australia, and Aus Sport, and gives coaches the opportunity to create change and have a genuine impact on sporting culture for years to come.

The 'Coach for All' program is a four-part series featuring two coaching legends: former Australian professional rugby league footballer and Sydney Roosters Head Coach, Trent Robinson, and Australian Paralympic wheelchair

THE PRIDE IN SPORT

THE PSI

The Pride in Sport Index (PSI) is an initiative of the Australian Human Rights Commission, Australian Sports Commission and a legacy of the Bingham Cup, Sydney. Initially, the PSI was developed in conjunction with a sports advisory group with representatives from Australian Human Rights Commission, Australian Sports Commission, Bingham Cup Sydney, ARU, AFL, FFA, NRL, Cricket Australia, Basketball Australia, Golf Australia, Swimming Australia and Water Polo Australia.

Leaders from ACON's Pride in Diversity program, who developed the internationally recognised, workplace index methodology, worked with these sports to create an instrument that would reflect and drive current LGBTQ inclusion practice in sport.

The PSI is reviewed every 3 years against current and international practice. Unlike an Awards process, the PSI is a rigorous benchmarking instrument that requires those participating to submit evidence against an established baseline criterion developed specifically to determine, measure and drive best practice.

Participating in the PSI allows sporting organisations to benchmark their practice against other sports, determine areas for improvement and areas in which the sport is currently excelling.



PRIDE IN SPORT INDEX

THE PRIDE IN SPORT INDEX 2023

Every year within both indices, sporting organisations are assessed and given a tier ranking.

- **Platinum:** Sporting organisations achieving Gold within four of the last five consecutive years.
- **Gold:** Top 10% (max) of sporting organisations obtaining the minimum score required for Gold Tier recognition
- **Silver:** Next 10% (max) of sporting organisations obtaining the minimum score required for Silver Tier recognition
- **Bronze:** Next 20% (max) of sporting organisations obtaining the minimum score required for Bronze Tier recognition.
- **Participating:** Those who have started work in LGBTQ inclusion but have not yet reached tier recognition.

All scores are confidential and organisations may also request to keep their ranking confidential.

HOW IS THE PSI MARKED?

All submissions are marked against evidence-based criteria by two independent markers on separate score sheets.

A comparison of the two score sheets is made to determine score discrepancies. If the two markers did not agree a point vale based on the evidence provided, the two markers return to the original submission to agree a final score. A third marker is called in if required.

Scores are then tallied, and entry points determined for each of the recognition tiers based on the scores obtained, the number of submissions and minimum points criteria for each recognition tier.
