Across the pond Adam has likewise become a household name with his talk show on Channel Four, The Last Leg. Having significantly advanced Lacrosse Victoria's LGBTQ+ focus, Kristen lives as a primary example of active allyship. Through her leadership, Lacrosse Victoria plays a key role in Proud2Play's Rainbow Sports Alliance, embracing the collective focus on LGBTQ+ inclusion to enhance organisational inclusivity. Kristen's commitment to education, leveraging personal funds for Allyship training, and her instrumental role in creating welcoming environments, such as the Lacrosse Together Program, exemplify her dedication. Her efforts in securing grants for inclusive programs and leading community engagement activities underscore her status as a deserving finalist for her impact on the sport and community.

DAVID KEOGH

David, a Committee Member at Collaroy Tennis Club, has significantly contributed to fostering an inclusive environment for the LGBTQ+ community within the sport of tennis. His proactive involvement in hosting LGBTQ+ activations and education sessions, in collaboration with Tennis NSW and Tennis Australia, highlights his dedication to inclusion. Notably, David's initiative to participate in the AO Pride Nights, incorporation of rainbow branding in tennis promotions, and creativity in showcasing allyship for others exemplifies his commitment to LGBTQ+ allyship. His advocacy and efforts have not only welcomed over 50 new LGBTQ+ members into the club but have also inspired

a culture of inclusion and support, making his finalist nomination a recognition of his impactful work in promoting LGBTQ+ inclusion at all levels.

SOPHIE MOORE

Through her leadership as Football Australia's National Member Protection Manager, Sophie stands out for her steadfast advocacy and allyship, with a strong focus for the inclusion of transgender athletes in football. Having played a pivotal role in promoting LGBTQ+ inclusion, and combating discrimination and hate speech at an unprecedented level for a national sporting organisation, Sophie has helped ensure the safety and respect of trans players across the sport. Through education, policy advocacy, and direct support in challenging times, Sophie has created a more inclusive environment, making significant strides towards equality in sports. Her commitment to protecting vulnerable individuals and fostering a culture of safety and inclusion is a reflection of her impactful contributions to LGBTQ+ inclusion in football.

KRISTEN PENNY

A brilliant example of an 'Active Ally', Kristen has been instrumental in spearheading LGBTQ+ inclusion initiatives at the National Basketball League. Her leadership in launching the NBL's Pride Round – a first for an entirely male professional code – and advocating for comprehensive support across professional teams has significantly advanced visibility and allyship for basketball. Under her guidance, the league has embraced their active allyship and transformed arenas into symbols of pride, demonstrating a never before seen commitment to inclusivity in men's professional basketball. Kristen's efforts have not only enhanced the welcoming atmosphere for athletes but have also set a precedent for sports organisations through her impactful contributions to diversity and inclusion.





LGBTQ+ INCLUSIVE COACH OF THE YEAR PROUDLY SPONSORED BY PLAY BY THE RULES

This award recognises the significant impact of coaches (including assistant coaches) within sport who support LGBTQ+ inclusion above and beyond the expectations of their role. This nomination is open to anyone who has a coaching role within sport, regardless of gender identity and sexual orientation.

At the Sydney Hookers, Founder and Head Coach Shaun has harnessed boxing as a powerful tool for community building and LGBTQ+ inclusion. By orchestrating initiatives such as an LGBTQ+ boxing tournament at the Gay Games and spearheading a partnership with Corporate Fighter, Shaun has opened the sport to a broader community, breaking down barriers of participation. His advocacy, including raising significant funds for LGBTQ+ charities, showcases his commitment to inclusivity. Shaun's efforts culminate in a welcoming space where individuals, regardless of identity, can engage in boxing, embodying the spirit of unity and empowerment.

TRENT ROBINSON

Within the Sydney Roosters NRL club and Allianz Coach For All program, Trent plays a crucial role in promoting inclusive coaching practices across Australian sports. His advocacy, including media appearances and social media campaigns, alongside facilitating LGBTQ+ Awareness training in cis-hetero male-dominated sporting environments, underscores his dedication to creating a welcoming environment in sport. Robinson's commitment to inclusivity, particularly in fostering a culture of inclusion among high-performance coaching staff in multiple sporting codes, highlights why his contributions are deserving of recognition in the realm of sports inclusion.

At the forefront of making martial arts more accessible to the LGBTQ+ community, Conscious Combat Club, under the leadership of Georgia, has introduced a transformative approach to kickboxing. By creating safe, inclusive spaces, and embracing LGBTQ+ community members, Georgia's initiatives, including collaborations with Queer Combat, emphasise autonomy, connection, and the importance of a welcoming environment, positioning her as a trailblazer and deserving nominee for her contributions to inclusivity in sports.

LIL WATERS

Through their coaching at Mt Alexander Falcons and public advocacy, Lil has become a beacon for inclusive coaching in the AFL. Their involvement in the documentary "Equal the Contest" and dedication to fostering an inclusive team culture have challenged stereotypes, creating a safe and welcoming environment here for all athletes. This approach not only enhances the sport's accessibility but also ensures every athlete can be their authentic self, making Lil's nomination a testament to their impactful contributions to sports inclusion.

Her article featuring Sam Kerr and the CommBank Matildas' commitment to LGBTQ+ pride during Sydney WorldPride 2023 stands out for its depth and sensitivity. Buratti's work, highlighting the team's embrace of LGBTQ+ pride-coloured numbers against Spain, not only helped raise awareness of authentic rainbow promotions but also fostered a spirit of inclusivity and acceptance, making her a deserving finalist for the Positive Media Award.

SAMANTHA LEWIS

A digital sports journalist at ABC News, Samantha has notably advanced LGBTQ+ visibility in football with her impactful coverage. Her article on the Matildas' support for the LGBTQ+ community during Sydney WorldPride and the FIFA Women's World Cup, alongside additional pieces on transgender inclusion and athlete coming-out stories, has significantly contributed to the conversation around diversity and inclusion in sports. Her work, which combines sensitivity with a deep understanding of the complexities of LGBTQ+ issues, has made her a deserving finalist for her role in expanding public awareness and promoting inclusivity within the sporting community.

Through his reporting for ABC News and Triple J, David spotlighted LGBTQ+ inclusion in sports, particularly via the story of A-League player Josh Cavallo. His work effectively raised awareness and promoted inclusivity within the sporting community, exemplifying high journalistic standards in covering sensitive issues of sexuality and inclusion. David's insightful storytelling and respectful portrayal have significantly contributed to expanding public knowledge and empathy towards LGBTQ+ athletes' experiences across Australia.

MITCH NIVALIS

Through their remarkable documentary "Equal the Contest," Mitch has made a significant contribution to the dialogue surrounding LGBTQ+ inclusion in Australian sports. Highlighting the experiences of women and those of diverse sexuality and gender, Mitch's story, rooted in personal experience, resonates on a global scale. Their work, featured in national and international film festivals, serves as a powerful tool for discussion and education on inclusivity in sporting cultures. It provides an innovative way of storytelling that continues to expand understanding and foster inclusion well beyond the publish date.

EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP AWARD PROUDLY SPONSORED BY ACON

This award recognises the outstanding contribution of a leader within Australian sport who has led by example in the LGBTQ+ inclusion space and made a significant contribution to the inclusion of people with diverse sexualities and/or genders with their sport or club. This nomination is open to anyone who has a leadership role within sport, regardless of gender identity and sexual orientation.

JOHN BAKER AM

As President of Surf Life Saving Australia, John has exemplified exceptional leadership in promoting LGBTQ+ inclusion within surf life saving on an international scale. His efforts, including championing the SLSA Pride Rescue Board, spearheading the Diversity & Inclusion Framework, and actively participating in Lifesavers with Pride events, have significantly advanced LGBTQ+ visibility and support. His proactive stance, evidenced by his participating in the Sydney Mardi Gras and strong advocacy for the community in both mainstream and traditionally conservative media, showcases his dedication to creating an inclusive and supportive environment for all members of what is both a sport and an emergency service.

SHAUN BARNETT

In his role as President of Perth Scorpions Volleyball Club, Shaun has transformed the landscape of LGBTQ+ inclusion in volleyball. Under his guidance, the club has seen remarkable initiatives, including the launch of an LGBTQ+ inclusive junior volleyball camp and the establishment of annual awards nights to celebrate diversity. His collaborative efforts with Volleyball Western Australia and active participation in community events like the WA Pride Parade and the annual Pride Cup have been instrumental in creating a

A trailblazer in sport climbing, Campbell exemplifies what it means to be a visible LGBTQ+ advocate. Campbell's journey to the Paris 2024 Olympics is a testament to their courage and resilience, breaking barriers as an openly gay athlete. Her dedication to enhancing LGBTQ+ visibility and support highlights the significant impact of her contributions.

MARTIN STARK

Through his visionary leadership, Martin has catapulted LGBTQ+ inclusion in boxing to unprecedented heights. In founding the World Gay Boxing Championships, Martin not only orchestrated this world's first inclusive boxing competition but also revolutionised the sport on a global scale. His tireless advocacy and collaborations have reshaped policies and perceptions, transforming World Gay Boxing Championships into a global example of positive change. Martin's efforts demonstrate an unwavering commitment to fostering a welcoming space in sports.





LGBTQ+ INCLUSIVE INNOVATION AWARD PROUDLY SPONSORED BY VICHEALTH

This award recognises an innovative inclusion initiative, product, service, or governance that promotes the inclusion of LGBTQ+ people within sport and recreation organisations at any level, or across the sport more broadly.

CHAMPION Q LEAGUE NETBALL

Championing a groundbreaking initiative, Q League Netball by QSA & Netball Victoria emerges as a world-first, offering a year-round inclusion platform for the LGBTQ+ community. This initiative has revolutionised how netball is viewed and played, providing a community league beyond the binary and fostering meaningful inclusion. Thanks to the collaboration between QSA, Netball Victoria, and Champion, Q League Netball has set a new benchmark for inclusivity in sports, making it a deserving nominee for its impactful contributions to the LGBTQ+ community and sport as a whole.

2023 NBL CHAMPION PRIDE ROUND

The NBL Champion Pride Round, initiated by the National Basketball League, stands as a landmark event in promoting LGBTQ+ inclusion within sports. This pioneering initiative, the first of its kind in an all-male league in Australia, not only supported the LGBTQ+ community but also underscored the NBL's commitment to diversity and inclusion. The round, enriched with educational programs for all club staff and athletes, multifaceted community engagement, and powerful partnerships, notably with Champion, highlighted the league's resolve to create an inclusive atmosphere, making it a deserving nominee for its impactful contribution to sports and the LGBTQ+ community.





LGBTQ+ INCLUSIVE INNOVATION AWARD PROUDLY SPONSORED BY VICHEALTH

RAINBOW RACQUETS

The Rainbow Racquets Squash initiative, in collaboration with Squash Australia, created a landmark moment for inclusivity through the Sydney WorldPride 2023 festival. This initiative not only brought together international players from diverse backgrounds for competition but also significantly raised awareness within the community about LGBTQ+ participation in squash. The efforts led to a substantial increase in club membership and the establishment of new clubs, highlighting a successful model for promoting inclusivity in sports on a national scale.

SYDNEY WORLDPRIDE TENNIS PROJECT

Through the Sydney WorldPride Tennis Project, Tennis NSW showcased a groundbreaking commitment to LGBTQ+ inclusion, leveraging a holistic and innovative approach at WorldPride sports festival. Collaborating with community partners and securing support from state government and Tennis Australia, the initiative achieved widespread impact with global acknowledgement. Focused on education, community engagement, and the promotion of inclusive events, the project effectively elevated the profile of LGBTQ+ inclusion in tennis, integrating broader diversity and inclusion efforts to create a lasting legacy for Sydney WorldPride 2023.

THE PSI

The Pride in Sport Index (PSI) is an initiative of the Australian Human Rights Commission, Australian Sports Commission and a legacy of the Bingham Cup, Sydney. Initially, the PSI was developed in conjunction with a sports advisory group with representatives from Australian Human Rights Commission, Australian Sports Commission, Bingham Cup Sydney, Rugby Australia, Australian Football League, Football Australia, National Rugby League, Cricket Australia, Basketball Australia, Golf Australia, Swimming Australia, and Water Polo Australia.

Leaders from ACON's Pride Inclusion Programs, who developed the internationally recognised, workplace index methodology, worked with these sports to create an instrument that would reflect and drive current LGBTQ+ inclusion practice in sport. Unlike a traditional awards process, the PSI is a rigorous benchmarking instrument that requires those participating to submit evidence against an established baseline criterion developed specifically to determine, measure, and drive best practice. Participating in the PSI allows sporting organisations to benchmark their work against other sports, determine areas for improvement and areas in which the sport is currently excelling.

The PSI follows a 3 yearly cycle of local index review and international benchmarking. Upon review, new criteria are set with the intention of advancing LGBTQ+ inclusion practice within Australian sport. Within each new iteration, there is an expectation that entry points into the respective tiers will change, and overall scores decrease. This is a pattern we see with the release of every new iteration. It's important that the expectations of submitting organisations take this into account with their goals within a new iteration. It's also important to note that the journey to maintain leading practice is not a 6-month journey; it's a 3+ year journey.

HOW IS THE PSI MARKED?

All submissions are marked against evidence-based criteria by two independent markers on separate score sheets. A comparison of the two score sheets is made to determine score discrepancies. If the two markers did not agree a point value based on the evidence provided, the two markers return to the



original submission to agree a final score. A third marker is called in if required. Scores are then tallied, and tier status is determined based on the scores obtained.

TIER RECOGNITION

It is also important to note that for the third iteration, the methodology of determining recognition for **Bronze, Silver** and **Gold** tier entry levels has changed. Entry points to each of these tiers in previous iterations have been determined by ranking the scores of all participating organisations and calculating the top consecutive percentages. This meant that, as practices improved or shifted, the entry points would change from year to year.

Starting with the 3rd iteration of the PSI, we have introduced fixed entry points for each of the tiers, making it easier to estimate where your tier recognition may fall.

To achieve **Bronze** Tier Status within the PSI Foundation Submission, participating organisations must obtain the following: **Community Sport** = 35% or 15/50 allocated points and **Standard PSI** = 70% or 35/50 allocated points.

To achieve **Silver** Tier Status within the PSI Advanced Submission, participating organisations must obtain the following: **Community Sport** = 50% or 25/50 allocated points and **Standard PSI** = 40% or 40/100 allocated points.

To achieve **Gold** Tier Status within the PSI Advanced Submission, participating organisations must obtain the following: **Community Sport** = 60% or 35/50 allocated points and **Standard PSI** = 60% or 60/100 allocated points.

Platinum Tier Status is the highest obtainable recognition within the PSI and acknowledges the highest levels of performance within the PSI over a sustained period. To obtain this prestigious recognition, organisations must be acknowledged as those whose commitment to LGBTQ+ inclusion is for the long-term. This can be achieved by:

1. Obtaining Gold Tier Status within the PSI for four out of the last five years of submissions, or

By winning Organisation of the Year twice within the same five-year period.
